In July, Fred "Slim" Soules #130 was our lone membership new inductee. Welcome and congratulations. His proud sponsor is Larry Caplinger #205. At our next regular monthly luncheon, which will be in September, I anticipate at least three additional new members to be inducted. From a random drawing the winner of a free lunch from those members having a July birthday is Dennis L. Waters #101. Congratulations. Our guest speaker at July's monthly luncheon was Julie von Savoye. Julie is the longtime Operations Manager at the Cutler Segerstrom Insurance Agency here in Sonora. She structured her presentation on the general theme of the skyrocketing property owners' insurance crisis and it consequences. Julie initially laid the foundation for the subject crisis as the consequence of the natural disasters that have occurred in the recent past. She then went on to discuss its impact on the following: national real estate sales, the chronic problems associated with the difficulties of simply acquiring the subject insurance due either to financial consideration and/or because of extreme environmental hazardous risks. Moreover, Julie did remark the effect this crisis has on insurance premium discounts. For example, whereby the insured may have possessed multiple coverages with a single insurer in the past, such as having bundled their automobile insurance and property insurance, when this situation is no longer a reality, the customer suffers as a result of being disqualified from capitalizing on insurance premium discounts. Interestingly, Julie then shifted lightly to the automobile insurance premiums which have experienced a fate somewhat resembling the property insurance situation. During the ensuing question and answer session, there were no shortages of attendees' remarks expressing their anecdotal experiences prevalent to the above-mentioned crisis.

Tickets for our Annual Family BBQ Picnic ("Picnic"), to be held on August 13th at the Indigeny Reserve, were made available for purchase at our July luncheon. Sales thus far have not been as robust as in the previous year. This in part may be influenced due to a conflict in schedule: it has been reported there is a bowling tournament occurring outside our area that has attracted a number of our members; thus, these individuals have decided to forgo our Picnic as a matter of choice. However, I have been somewhat encouraged by the trickling of ticket sales post the July luncheon by our members. Additionally, ticket sales have gradually increased due to non-member interests. Again, it is worthy to keep in mind that children of the ages up to 12 are entitled to a free luncheon that includes hot dogs etc. As these "NOTES" are being prepared for submittal to comply with the online posting deadline, there are only two entries manifested in our Raffle Donation Register. Consequently, I encourage much greater participation by all members having ambition of attending our Picnic. Otherwise, dismal results will prevail. To insure a positive experience for all attendees, a collaborative effort remains the responsibility with each and every valued member within our organization for success is not achieved without due diligence.

I wish to call upon three or four of our faithful members to make themselves available the day after the Picnic, which happens to be August 14th (on Wednesday), to meet at Earl Randall's residence for the purpose of cleaning and storing the Picnic equipment that he so graciously provided. After all, without his involvement the Picnic experience would obviously be much different and less satisfying. By returning such a favor to Earl, perhaps we can provide him with a sense of gratitude for all that he has done for all of us as it relates to this special summer event. Thanking you in advance.


