The signers of our Declaration acknowledged that man not only needed political freedoms, but also needed spiritual freedoms to worship God. In the second paragraph of the Declaration of Independence, the authors wrote "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of happiness." They refer to God as their creator.

Peter wrote "You are free from the law, but that doesn't mean that you are free to do wrong." We are free to worship God, but not to break the law (to sin.)

We are to live like people who are free to do only God's will at all times. (1 Peter 2:16-17 The Living Bible) We are to show respect for everyone, to love people everywhere, and to fear God and honor the government.

Far from being self-reliant, we are totally and eternally dependent on the One who created and died for us. "I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in Him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing". (John 15:5).

The proper use of freedom is "faith working through love" to serve one another (Galatians 5:6, 13). Let's always use our liberty to build up, not to tear down. Controlled freedom then becomes a blessing.




