Wow, time is just flying by, we are almost half way through 2019. I want to take this opportunity to thank those members that helped man our booth at the Home & Garden Show last month. We were able to talk to several potential members and gave out membership applications. We did receive applications from Bill Vaughan and Fred (Slim) Soules. We are down to 211 members currently. We lost 14 members last month due to normal attrition. We must continue to invite guests to our luncheons. Last month I gave out \$5.00 to members that had a filled in "What Do We Do" cards.
